

Uzbekistan

Responding to a request from the Office of the Secretary of Defense, the Modeling and Simulation Information and Analysis Center (MSIAC) briefed Minister Kodir G. Gulomov of Uzbekistan last October on services and support available from the MSIAC. The briefing presented by MSIAC Director, Mr. Phil Abold, covered MSIAC's capabilities and experience with U.S., NATO and Partnership for Peace M&S efforts, as well as a broad exchange of ideas on how best to employ M&S. Minister Gulomov, who holds doctoral degrees in physics and economics, demonstrated keen insight into M&S applications, benefits and limitations.

MSIAC Expands Outreach Efforts

Recently, the Undersecretary of Defense (Acquisition, Technology, and Logistics) was assigned responsibility for approving all models and simulations used by the Department of Defense to depict or study the use of chemical and biological weapons. The USD(AT&L) subsequently assigned specific oversight of this area to the Assistant to the Secretary of Defense, Nuclear, Chemical and Biological Defense Programs. Dr. Anna Johnson-Winegar, Assistant to the Secretary of Defense, Nuclear, Chemical and Biological Defense Programs, will spearhead the work. Shortly after taking on the task, Dr. Johnson-Winegar's staff turned to the Modeling and Simulation Information and Analysis Center (MSIAC) for help.

Based on this briefing, MSIAC is working closely with OSD to formalize a statement of work to provide the following services to the Uzbeki Ministry of Defence—

- MSIAC will help the MoD establish an M&S infrastructure.
- MSIAC will incorporate an M&S education initiative into the Uzbekistan Service Academy.
- MSIAC help the Uzbekistan MoD with military to military contacts for computer assisted exercises (CAX).

The work by MSIAC is part of a larger effort by the US to assist in reforming Uzbekistan's military forces to better suit their emerging needs. Uzbekistan declared its independence from the former Soviet Union in 1991 and is interested in reshaping its armed forces to defend against insurgents and promote regional stability.

MSIAC Expands Outreach Efforts (continued)

Dr. Johnson-Winegar's first task was to create a senior policy board and working level group to assist her efforts. She asked the MSIAC to draft the charter for the DoD Chemical and Biological Modeling and Simulation Oversight Group (MSOG), and the MSOG Council of Colonels (CoC). These groups will assist the Dr. Johnson-Winegar in matters concerning common use CB models, simulations, and associated data. After completing the charter, MSIAC analysts have begun developing an M&S master plan for chem-bio defense matters. The master plan will guide use of models and simulations and policy development in this area.

The MSOG charter drafted by the MSIAC was distributed to 140 participants at a MORS WMD Workshop in February. Coincidentally, Dr. Johnson-Winegar, formally announced the creation of the DoD Chemical and Biological Modeling and Simulation Oversight Group at the workshop.
